## Friday Highlights

### Durga Stuti

Nilanjana Banerjee is an eminent dance performer specializing in Odissi. She has performed extensively for the Indian diaspora in the US. Her dance is characterized by



fast footworks, sculpture-inspired postures, emotional rendering of rasas, and above all devotion.

For more than a decade, Nilanjana has trained and performed as the principal dancer at RDM - Rhythms of Dance & Music under the guidance of Nrityangana Mahari award winner, Guru Mitra Purkayastha. Some of her highlight solo performances which received critical acclaim include Regional Bengali Conference 2011, opening night in Nashville prior to Kavita Krishnamurthy, Banga Mela 2013 in Cincinnati prior to Anjan Dutta, R. Muralidharan's magnum opus Sense & Beyond 2012, CID UNESCO, Montreal 2013 & Tribute concert 2014 at Gyan Manch, Kolkata. Nilanjana is currently based in San Diego.

Manomay is the fifth generation of JADUBHATTA. Manomay Bhattacharya has a sweet voice. He has had solid training in music at the age of 4 under the vigilant guidance of father Sri Dhrubadas Bhattacharya, a disciple of Subinoy Roy, and mother IIa



Bhattacharya, a disciple of Ratneswar Mukherjee.

Manomay places himself under the tutelage of Benukumar Dobey,

Bibhuti Bose & Jayanta Bose, who trained him a finer nuance of Classical music. He learnt Tagore songs from father and various items of songs viz. Nazrul Geeti, Rajnikanter Gaan, Atulprasad, Dewijendra Geeti, Ragpradhan, Bhajan & Modern Bengali songs from illustrious teachers like Biman Mukhopadhyay, Sukumar Mitra, Dilip Roy, Anal Chattopadhyay, Sanjay Chakraborty, Jatileshwar Mukhopadhyay and still in close touch with Pandit Ajay Chakraborty with whom varied songs are learnt.

Rajeeb began performing from as early as 9 years. The Prayag Sangeet Samity, Allahabad awarded him gold medals in both "Sangeet Prabhakar" in 1989 and "Sangeet Praveen" in 1991 for his profound understanding of instrumental music and a proficiency in its theoretical aspects. Apart from being a scholar in Indian classical music Dr. Chakraborty earned his degrees in Western classical music from Royal College of Music (London) with distinction. Rajeeb has participated in innumerous concerts and major music festivals which include the Bath Festival, Chester Summer Festival, Vienna Festival, and Edinborough Festival to name a few.

> In the year 1892, Rabindranath Tagore, the great Indian litterateur, poet and Nobel recipient gave a new dimension to the story of Chitrangada and set it in a dance drama. Inspired by her persona, Tagore embellished the character of Chitrangada with the myriad emotions of a woman.

This timeless musical dance drama is a lyrical

portrayal of emotions in a woman, her dignity, individuality and worthiness that is as relevant in today's life as it was eons ago.



### MOTHER GODDESS: UNEARTHING THE UNDERLYING FACTS

Goddess Durga symbolizes the positive energy known as 'Divine Shakti' to conquer against the negative forces of evil and wickedness. Goddess Durga is depicted as a warrior woman with ten hands carrying different weapons along with three eyes and riding on a lion. But have we ever wondered to understand the true facts behind such manifestation of the Supreme Goddess?

In order to understand the facts behind such manifestation, let us have a journey back to the ages when the Supreme Goddess was being mentioned in many scriptures e.g. Yajur Veda, Vajasaneyi Samhita and Taittareya Brahman (composition dating back to 1200 to 1000 BC).

The word "Durga" in Sanskrit means a fort, or a place which is difficult to overrun. Another meaning of "Durga" is "Durgatinashini," which literally translates into "the one who eliminates sufferings." Thus, Hindus believe that goddess Durga protects her devotees from the evils of the world and at the same time removes their miseries. The legend is that whenever her devotees needed the "Shakti" to ward off evil for their lives, Goddess Durga manifested in one of her many forms and vanquished the demons. Here evil forces refer to the negative energy and vices e.g. arrogance, jealousy, prejudice, hatred, anger, greed and selfishness.

The epic battle of the mother Goddess against the tyrant Mahishasura has been portrayed in detail in *The Markandeya Purana* under *Devi Mahatmya* (Glorification of the Great Goddess). The Markandeya Purana is one of the eighteen major Mahapuranas (Purana is a genre of Hindu religious texts) composed during 400 – 500 AD and contains 9000 verses.

As per Davadatta Kali, Devi Mahatmya is seen as an attempt to unify the Vedic male pantheon with the pre-existing mother goddess worship possibly dating to the 9th millennium BC [Kali, Davadatta (translator and commentator) (2003). Devimahatmya: In praise of the Goddess.] and is an attempt to define divinity as a shakti, which takes form of the female gender, and that pervades all beings and non-beings and yet is transcendental.

Swami Jagadiswarananda shows that Devi Mahatmya synthesizes a number of pre-existing mother goddess mythological puranas into a single narrative. [Swami Jagadiswarananda, Devi Māhātmyam. p vi]

As described in Chapters 81 – 93 in Markandeya Purana, Mahishasura, the son of demon Rambha, gathered strong powers from Lord Brahma as a reward for his penance and eventually obtained a boon from Lord Brahma which indicated that no man would kill him. After that the demon king unleashed reign of terror on earth. When gods intervened, Mahishasura defeated gods and banished them from heaven. Vanquished gods went to Trideva - Brahma, Vishnu and Shiva. As they narrated their woeful tales, immense mass of light manifested from Lord Vishnu's mouth, which was joined by similar rays that emerged from the enraged faces of gods. This mass of light transformed into a primordial energy out of which, a magnificent Goddess was born. She was blessed with all the powers given to her by the Gods. She also acquired her weaponry for her 10 hands from all different Gods with Lord Shiva providing Trident, Lord Vishnu offering Discus, Varuna giving Conch, Agni granting Spear, Vayu lending Arrows, Indra presenting Thunderbolt, Yama handing out Sword and shield, Vishwakarma delivering Axe and armour, Himalaya extending Lion and Jewels and finally other Gods handing out Lotus and magical offerings. She was decked with jewelery and cloths and the supreme Goddess re-manifested as Durga to slay Mahishasura.

Armed with celestial weapons of all deities and decked with divine ornaments, Durga rode lion into the battle field and challenged demons for battle. Mahishasura's entire army attacked Durga at once. But Durga slew all of them with unparalleled cruelty. An enraged Mahishasura attacked Durga in guise of a buffalo. But Durga bound it with ropes. The buffalo morphed into a lion and leapt on Durga, but she beheaded it with her sword. Then, Mahishasura began to fight in form of a swordsman. Durga pinned him down with a torrent of arrows. Mahishasura now assumed form of a giant elephant and tugged at Durga's lion. Durga lopped off its trunk with her sword and freed her lion. The elephant turned into a buffalo and charged at Durga. Eventually, Mother Goddess flung her trident and beheaded Mahishasura.

We have to understand that Goddess Durga is a symbol of power and divinity as well as compassion for her devotees. Her ten arms symbolizes that she protects her devotees from all ten directions. Mother Goddess is also depicted with three eyes, the third being placed in the center of the forehead. Left and Right eyes are representation of the moon and the sun. The third eye represents fire.

Each of the weapons in all ten hands have some special significance and let us walk over it and see how those should be perceived into our realization.

*Chakra* –The Chakra that spins in the little index finger of the first upper right hand of the Goddess symbolizes righteousness or dharma. The Goddess uses this weapon to destroy evil and protect righteousness. What this teaches us is that we all must perform our duty/responsibilities in life with utmost attention and care.

*Conch* – There is Conch in her first upper left hand and it stands for the cosmic sound of 'OM'. The vibration created by the Conch has the power to destroy all evil negative forces and when we pray to the Goddess, we are supposed to get filled with peace and tranquility. In a way the Conch symbolizes happiness. Thus for us it points that we must perform our duty happily and cheerfully without any resentment.

*Sword* – Next weapon for Mother Goddess in her second right lower hand is Sword. What is a Sword for? It signifies knowledge and intellect, as sharp as the blade of the sword. Therefore the Goddess bestows us with the gift of knowledge to remove the veil of ignorance that binds our souls. Consecutively, we must learn to discriminate and eradicate our evil qualities by sharpening our knowledge and intellect.

*Bow and Arrow* – The Supreme Goddess possess Bow and Arrow in her second left hand. These pair of weapons symbolize energy including potential (carried by bow) and kinetic (developed in arrow). The whole purpose is to destroy the difficulties arising in one`s path in life. The Goddess in turn is sending message for us so that all obstacles may get removed by using a combination

of potential and kinetic energy just as evident in our values or character. We must realize that should we face any difficulties in our life, we must not lose our values but must inculcate in ourselves the power of potential and kinetic energy in terms of our character to fight with problems and eventually win over them.

*Lotus* – Lotus Flower in Her third lower left hand symbolizes detachment. It can be thought as a symbol for awakening of spiritual consciousness in a soul. Divine Mother shall help her devotees to understand the transience of life and seek the ultimate truth. What is translates to us is that we should be able to achieve our true objective in life amidst all the sins and evils surrounding us. The analogy is similar like the lotus flower which is born and stays in dirty water yet mesmerizes the world with its beauty and charm. It is also interesting to note that the lotus in Durga's hand is not fully bloomed thus indicating certainty of success but not finality.

*Club* – This is seen in her third right lower hand and it has the power to destroy the enemy, however powerful the enemy may be. Mother Goddess' grace will help defeat our enemies. This teaches us devotion and surrender. It shows us that whatever we do in our life, we must do with love and devotion and only then the outcome will be favorable.

*Trident* – Trishul or trident is seen in Her fourth left hand. This symbolizes the three human qualities – sattwa (Inactivity or the ideal state of mind characterized by awareness and purity of thought), rajas (activity or energy associated with desires, wishes and ambitions) and tamas (lethargy and stress). In order to attain peace and happiness, there needs to be balance between these three qualities. Her grace will give us the courage to fight the dark qualities arising in one due to the imbalance of the three qualities. Thus we must learn that we must have the courage to eliminate our evil qualities and face the challenges in our life.

*Thunderbolt* – This weapon of Mother Goddess is a symbol of firmness of spirit like that required in convictions. Praying to Mother Durga will help shatter the problems encountered in life without losing confidence and the Goddess must shower her devotees with unshaken confidence and will. This conveys to us that we need to attack our fears and challenge it with an unyielding firmness and exceptional confidence.

*Spear* – Another weapon of interest is a Spear that helps to destroy the negative and evil forces and grants auspiciousness.

*Blessings* – In one hand the Goddess does not hold anything and it is the Blessing hand (Abhaya Hastham). This symbolizes forgiveness and Her blessings. The teaching that applies to us is that we must learn to forgive ourselves and others for mistakes we may have caused.

The supreme Goddess rides on a lion. A lion is a symbol of unlimited power. And for Mother Goddess riding on a lion shows that She possesses control over unlimited power and uses it to protect virtue and destroy evil. In another way lion signifies uncontrolled characteristics of mind such as anger, arrogance, selfishness, greed, jealousy, desire to harm others etc. and for Mother Goddess sitting on it teaches us to control these qualities, so that we are not controlled by them.

Maa Durga is usually shown wearing a red sari. The color red is indicative of actions as the Goddess destroys all evils protecting mankind from pain and suffering.

Thus, the ultimate message that Goddess Durga sends to her devotees is that armed with the force of righteousness, we can achieve the victory over all the evil forces inside us leading to success and happiness paving the way to rise to the spiritual well-beings.

Let us assemble together and pray to the Universal Mother, asking Her to use Her destructive power to remove the vices, imperfections and faults within us (anger, selfish desires, greed, ego and undue attachments), and let our souls get purified so that we can become true receptacle of her Divine Energy.

Ya Devi Sarva Bhutesu, Shanti Roopena Samsitha (The goddess who is omnipresent as the personification of universal mother) Ya Devi Sarva Bhootesu, Shakti Roopena Samsthita (The goddess who is omnipresent as the embodiment of power) Ya Devi Sarva Bhootesu, Matra Roopena Samsthita (The goddess who is omnipresent as the symbol of peace) Yaa Devi Sarva Bhooteshu, Buddhi Roopena Samsthita (The goddess who resides everywhere in all living beings as intelligence and beauty) Namastasyai, namastasyai, namastasyai, namo namaha! (I bow to her, I bow to her, I bow to her again & again.)

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
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### Kisholoy and Latika Goswami - An Entrepreneuring Couple

Kisholoy and Latika Goswami co-founded InnoSense LLC in 2002 in the Los Angeles area to advance the field of applied science for improving life on earth.
